**NOTE:** MATH 220, MATH 140, or STAT 100 are also approved math courses for the CCJS major.

**\*NOTE:** SOCY 201, PSYC 200, BMGT 230, and ECON 321 can substitute for CCJS 200. Additionally first preference for enrollment in CCJS 200 is given to currently declared CCJS majors.

**\*\*NOTE:** Students have to take either CCJS 451, 452, or 454; students do not have to complete all three courses.
